Funds from Powering Potential Fund	Recipient Organization	Project Description
8,000	Troll Ski Resort	Commissioned off-season earthmoving work to build the base for a permanent slopestyle terrain park to host freestyle and snowboarding slopestyle competitions.
4,000	Freestyle BC	Funding to support the injection of PSO staff travel, time, and expertise in running NCCP coaching course, officials development and club governance start-up to establish a new Troll Freestyle and Snowboard Club. As of January 2024, 30 youth signed up to the new club, including 8 girls.
6,500	Judo BC - Kokoro Judo Club (100 Mile House)	Acquisition of a high-end Judo roll-out mat that will be a legacy to the Kokoro Judo Club. Four-way funding from the BC Games Society, Lhtako Quesnel 2024 BC Winter Games Society, Judo BC, and the Kokoro Judo Club to support costs associated with hosting Judo competition. No judo club existed in the host community. Regional support to run this technical tournament has been beneficial.
6,000	Karate BC - Nechako Karate Club (Prince George)	Acquisition of a high-end puzzle piece karate mat that will be a legacy to the Nechako Karate Club. Four-way funding from the BC Games Society, Lhtako Quesnel 2024 BC Winter Games Society, Karate BC, and the Nechako Karate Club to support costs to hosting the karate competition at the Games. No formal karate club existed in the host community. Regional club support to run this technical tournament has been beneficial.
5,000	Cariboo Ski Touring Club (Biathlon)	Partial funding to contribute to extensive biathlon range upgrades at Hallis Lake Cross Country Skiing Facility. The project involved building a concrete truss roof structure over the shooting platforms, installation of permanent shooting targets, lighting the range for evening sessions and enhancements to shooting platforms. Upwards of 700 hours in the form of a club work party and an approximate project cost of \$80,000.
2,500	Quesnel Techniques Gymnastics Club	Funding to help the club deliver NCCP coaching courses: Foundations Introduction, Foundations Artistic, and Foundations Active Start modules through the NCCP Gymnastics Foundation pathway. Eleven participants from Quesnel and Williams Lake attended this session.
3,148	viaSport	Funding to cover a pre-Games in-person coaching development retreat hosted by viaSport Coach Mentorship Program and a CSI Pacific Master Mentor Coach. Seven Coaches attended the session and also completed the NCCP Coach Mentorship module, as well as Games-time coach development.
4,850	Quesnel Curling Club	Funding to help the Quesnel Curling Club complete the elevator certification and to support the facility accessibility upgrade. The Curling Club will be used as an Opening Ceremony Live Watch Party location as well as for four days of curling competition.
10,000	City of Quesnel - Arts and Recreation Centre	Acquisition of a 'Wibit' pool play equipment to enhance the participant experience and for ongoing use by the Quesnel Arts and Recreation Centre. The Quesnel Arts and Recreation Centre was a key faculty, serving as the Friday Participant Special Event site and will be used extensively throughout the Games as a shower facility for many sports.
